

TUESDAY NIGHT PICKLEBALL @ MCC



Age Restrictions

- Players 12 years and older are invited to play. Players 12-16 years old must have a parent/guardian as their partner.
- 16+ can play without parent as long as they know how to play the game.
- Children are allowed to sit at the wall to watch their parents play, so long as they are not a distraction to other players.
- Childcare is available to pickleball players (at the standard MCC rate).

Etiquette

- Balls hit onto other courts—Loudly call out, “BALL!” and wait for the ball to be tossed back to you. Do not cross onto someone else’s court to retrieve a ball.
- Be respectful of other player’s playing ability.
- If a conflict arises and cannot be resolved between the involved parties, please contact staff at the Front Desk.

Court Schedule:

FROM 5-6 p.m.

BEGINNER’S COURT = COURT 1

- Court 1 will be reserved for any beginner’s seeking to learn the game or work on their new pickleball skills with other newer players.
- Instruction may or may not be available, depending on availability of volunteer pickleballers.
- If you are completely new to the game, we encourage you to check out the numerous “How to Play Pickleball” videos available on Youtube and at usapickleball.com before taking to the court.
- Players 12-16 years old must have a parent as their partner when playing on the Beginner’s Court.
- Courts 2 & 3 will be available for pickleball games for experienced players (players 12-16 must be with parent/guardian and have the ability to play a competitive game).

FROM 6-8 p.m.

- Courts 1-3 will be available for pickleball games for experienced players (players 12-16 must be with parent/guardian and have the ability to play a competitive game).
- Games will be played to 11 points (win by 2), unless a line of 8+ players has formed, at which time games will be played to 8 points (win by 1), until less than 8 people are waiting.
- One person needs to LOUDLY announce, “PLAYING TO 8 POINTS!” so all players know what to expect (same when switching back to 11 point games).
- When courts are being played and a wait forms, sit or stand in line or use your paddle to hold your place in line.
